I will shortly be writing to parents of year 12 students to invite them to an information session to outline our approach to teaching and learning to ensure the best results possible, and a smooth transition to life after school. I am not unaware of rumblings about the performance of last year's cohort and, although this does not seem to have impinged adversely on their plans for the future, I would wish to reassure our current Year 12 parents.

INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

To be candid we have suffered a little from a lack of connectivity in our new buildings largely because we simply could not get the necessary equipment installed in time for the start of term. Most of the necessary infrastructure is now in-place and we are hopeful of having a functioning network across the whole School this week. I am grateful to students, staff and parents for their forbearance during this period. Our IT Network Manager, Mr. Nathan Abbott, has done sterling work in this regard for which I am most grateful.

SKOOLBAG

Speaking of communications may I remind you that we have signed-up to use an App called Skoolbag: this allows us to keep in-touch via iPhone or iPad (and, we hope, android later). We believe that it is a very effective way to alert you to events, changes of routine and other news; equally you can inform us of absences for example. If you have an iPhone or iPad I would urge you to download the App so we can start trying to use it. To get the App you need to search for Esperance Anglican Community School Skoolbag and make sure you check the iPhone tab – we can then link with each other. I do hope this will work well so please keep in-touch with your thoughts once we have started to communicate using the App.

Our Year 9s will, of course, be attending the Canberra Camp at the start of next term but planning is underway and parents will be contacted in due course about the details.


ACTIVITIES

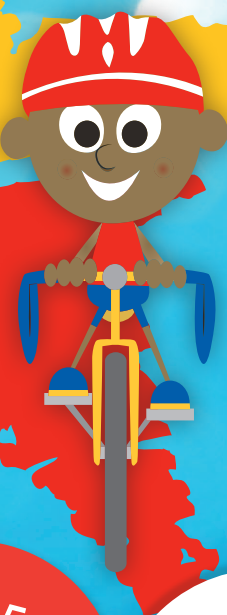
