The Award aims to recognise students internationally who take part in learning a new skill, improve their physical wellbeing, volunteer in the community and experience a team adventure. All participants are supported by a network of adult Award Leaders, Assessors, Mentors and Supervisors. All logs are reported online, and activities are tailored to the individuals wants and needs.

It is very exciting to have such an award existing at the School with the hope that it reinforces students to challenge themselves and step outside their comfort zone. It is offered to students aged 14-25, and equips them with life-long skills, while also increasing their career opportunities. A wonderful opportunity and one not to be missed! ### What is the Duke of Ed?

The Duke of Edinburgh's International Award equips young people for life and work. Participants design their own unique program that challenges them to set and meet goals while forging qualities of strength, resolve and commitment. Open to young people aged 14 to 25, the Award is run in over 140 countries and is available at Bronze, Silver and Gold levels. Each of these levels has four Sections - Skill, Service, Physical Recreation and Adventurous Journeys. Additionally, the Gold Award has an fifth Section - the Residential Project.
