ANZAC Dav

The action started earlier in the week for Head Girl, Lucy Gardiner, and Head Boy, Troy Edwards, as they participated in the ANZAC Day Parade and Service. It was good, too, that other students were also present in other organisations such as the Cadets and Scouts. In our Assembly the following day Monica Dellaca and Adam Edwards read the poems they had composed as part of their English class. They really were first-rate and very moving, complemented nicely by an anonymous video presentation by one of their peers. It is good to see our young people engaging, in such a meaningful way, in this important act of remembrance.

Aussie of the Month

Something of the ANZAC spirit was seen in each of the students who were presented with certificates recently in our newly introduced 'Aussie of the Month' award. This considers traits such as fair play, generosity of spirit, community participation and concern for our environment: teachers log-on SEQTA cases, for individual students, where such traits have been exhibited. A discussion of potential awardees follows at the end of each month before a final choice, by year group, is made. This award complements very neatly our whole ethos and should prove a popular and worthwhile incentive.
