Dear Parents and Carers,

A warm welcome back to the School for the start of Term 3 in what has proved to be a distinctly cold, wet and windy week.

Activities

The inclement weather has not proved to be a barrier to our involvement in the great outdoors with students in Years 11 and 12 braving the freezing waters of the bay to continue their windsurfing. Students taking the aquatics elective have been involved in collecting sand samples from a number of our beaches to allow students from UWA to analyse the extent of the presence of micro particles of plastics. These samples will be analysed at the School next week, giving our students the chance to experience 'real' science.

Forensics Workshop

Students in Years 7-10 also had hands-on science in the shape of a very successful series of workshops using forensic techniques to investigate a sample crime scene, and then deduce who the perpetrator might be.
