THE ACTOR'S LAB 'MONDAYS IN MAY'

Join *The Actor's Lab* at WAAPA for 'Mondays in May' – it will have your acting muscles working overtime! This course is designed for those who want to continue to develop their acting skills and engage in activities designed to empower them to perform more truthfully. ACTING FOUNDATION COURSE

This intensive actor training course runs over a 10-week period for four hours every Saturday. The ways in which vocal technique, physical expression and imagination assist the actor will be explored and applied to improvisations, scripted scenes and monologues. A screen component is included which covers techniques specific to working in film and TV, including auditions and self-tapes.

SCREEN ACTING COURSE
