Don't Let The Dog Days Of Summer Wreak Havoc On Your Technology

July just gave us real-feel temperatures over 100°F

Heat and technology don't mix. We're talking about things like PCs, servers and everything inside of them. A lot of manufacturers try to make sure the heat generated by hardware has a way to escape, but it's not always enough. And what about heat from the outside? This is where problems can really get out of control.

Right now, we're in the dog days of summer. The temperatures are high and air conditioners are running at full capacity in an attempt to keep us cool. As you run your business, your technology is running and generating its own heat, as well. If it can't keep cool, the end result can be disastrous.

Why Every Business Should Take Heat Seriously

Smaller devices like laptops, tablets and more compact desktop computers are especially susceptible

to heat damage simply because they are not as efficient at removing heat internally. As they heat up, their performance degrades. If they get hot enough, it can cause irreparable damage. Most devices will automatically shut down if they get too hot - you want to avoid getting to that point as much as you can.

Overheating can also cause damage to specific components. There have been reports of graphics cards catching on fire due to heat and heat-caused electrical issues. Heat can also destroy CPUs. While CPUs are designed to withstand the high temperatures created by processing data, they have their limits. If the computer is forced to overwork as it tries to stay cool, the end result can be a melted CPU!

Quick Tech Productivity Pointers

Part of my work includes introducing my clients to new facets of the applications they use and how to use them "better" or more efficiently. On a recent call with a proficient user, I was asked how to make the Outlook interface 'work better'.

Here are some of the issues we resolved for the client:

- 1. We adjusted the default font size because an 8 point Segoe UI was too small.
- The default font used in e-mail messages was also too small—Calibri 11 point font.
- It was also annoying to the user to open a print job in Outlook or create a new e-Mail.

These were the steps used in all three requests...

1.a. Look below the menu bar, you will see the *simplified* ribbon.

1.b. Go to the far right and click on the downward pointing "arrow". This will reveal the *classic* ribbon.

1.c. Click on "View" in the Menu bar.

1.d. Click in the *Current View* in the ribbon on the *View Settings* (gear) icon.

1.e. The *Advanced View Settings Preview* will appear. Click on the *Other Settings...* button.

1.f. The *Other Settings* dialog box appears. Here you may adjust/change the font and font size for Column Font, Row Font and Message Preview Font. We tend to prefer the Tahoma 12 point font in Outlook. To test the appearance of the modified view, try our suggestion, then reset it to the default. See if it fits your preferences, if not change it. Each font is displayed as it actually appears, so you can find your choice faster.

1.g. When you have what you like, simply click on the OK button. You may, at any time, modify other aspects of the view. We strongly suggest that you note your settings BEFORE you apply them just in case you are not happy. If worse comes to worst, you may also hit *Reset View*.

2.a. To set your default message body font, you click on the menu bar > *File* > *Options* > *Mail*.

2.b. Click on the Stationery and Fonts... button.

2.c. Under the *Personal Stationery* tab, you may select a font for New Mail messages, Replying or Forwarding, and Composing and Reading Plain Text messages. You will adjust the fonts in the same manner you used in **1.f.** Once you have made your selection, click on the OK button.

2.d. Open a new message and observe the change in how your message is customized to your taste.

3.a. The Quick Access Toolbar appears in the top frame of all Microsoft Office applications. You should recognize it as follows:



3.b. Each icon represents a single action that you may perform by clicking on any of them. You may note that only available actions remain "lit" for you to use.

3.c. The most direct method to access the option and modify the toolbar is to click on the down arrow to the right. This will offer you preset items to enable or disable. You will also have two more options:

More Commands.... This will take you to the *File > Options > Quick Access Toolbar* where you may make more extensive changes.

Show Below the Ribbon. Allows you to have the Quick Access Toolbar displayed in an alternative location. We hope this helps you at work. If you want to see more tips like this, please send us an e-mail with a suggestion.
