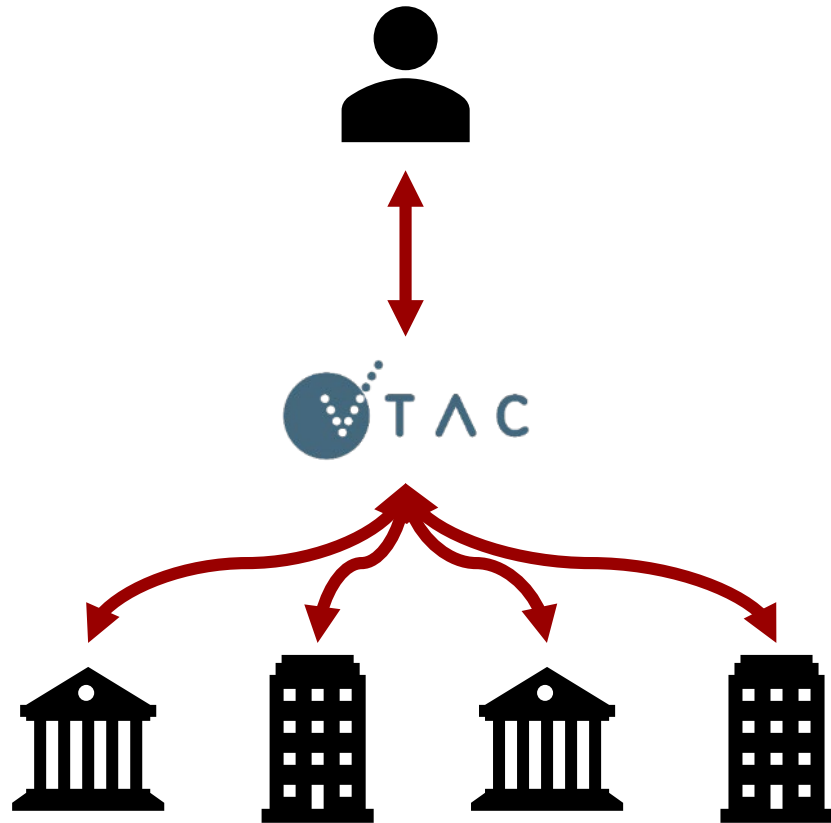

- The Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) is the central point for applications to Victorian universities, TAFEs, and Independent Tertiary Colleges.
- VTAC also calculates the Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) for Victorian Year 12 students.



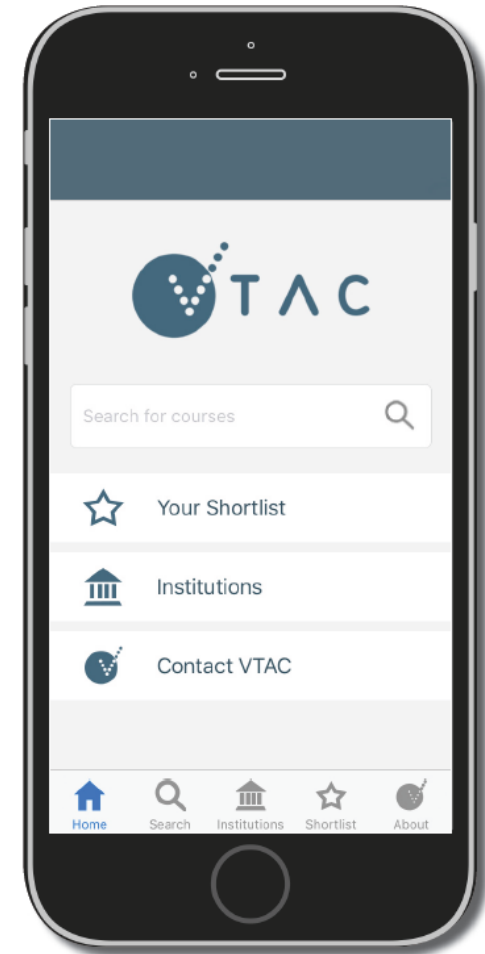

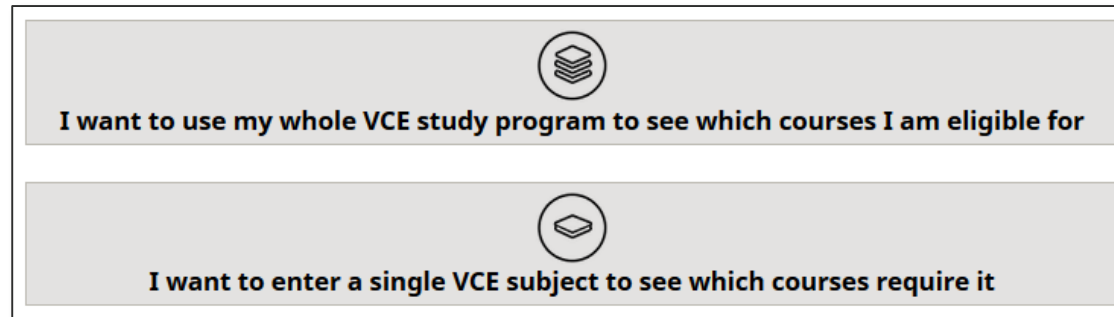

- You can also use the Prerequisite and Course Explorer from inside the app – enter your VCE studies to find courses where you meet the prerequisites

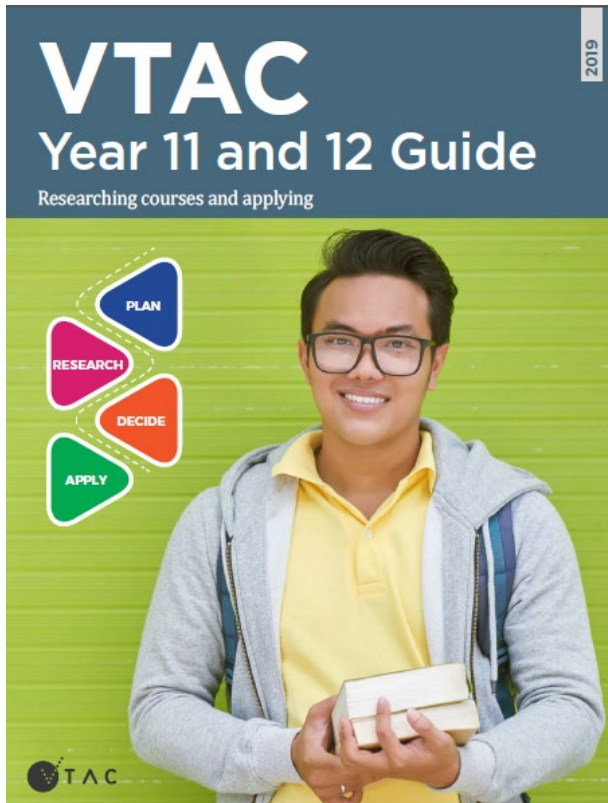


Prerequisite and Course Explorer

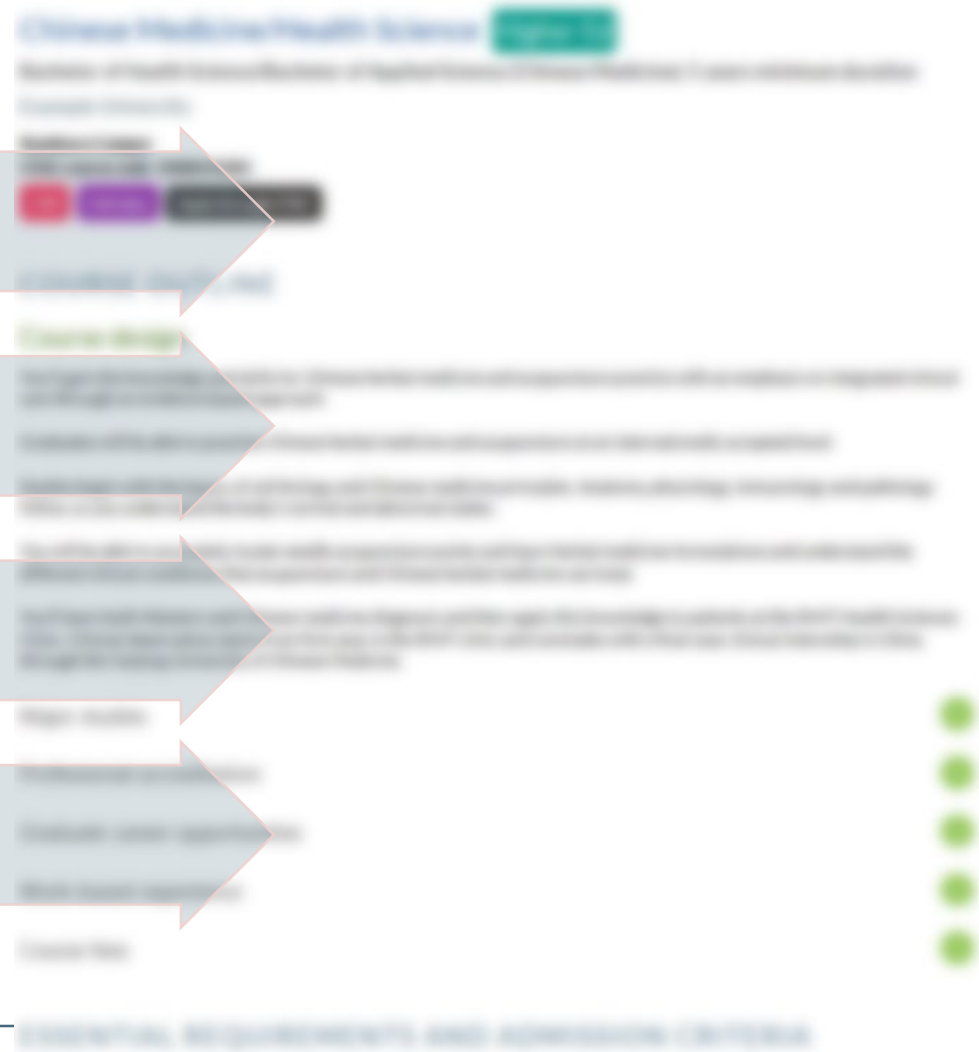

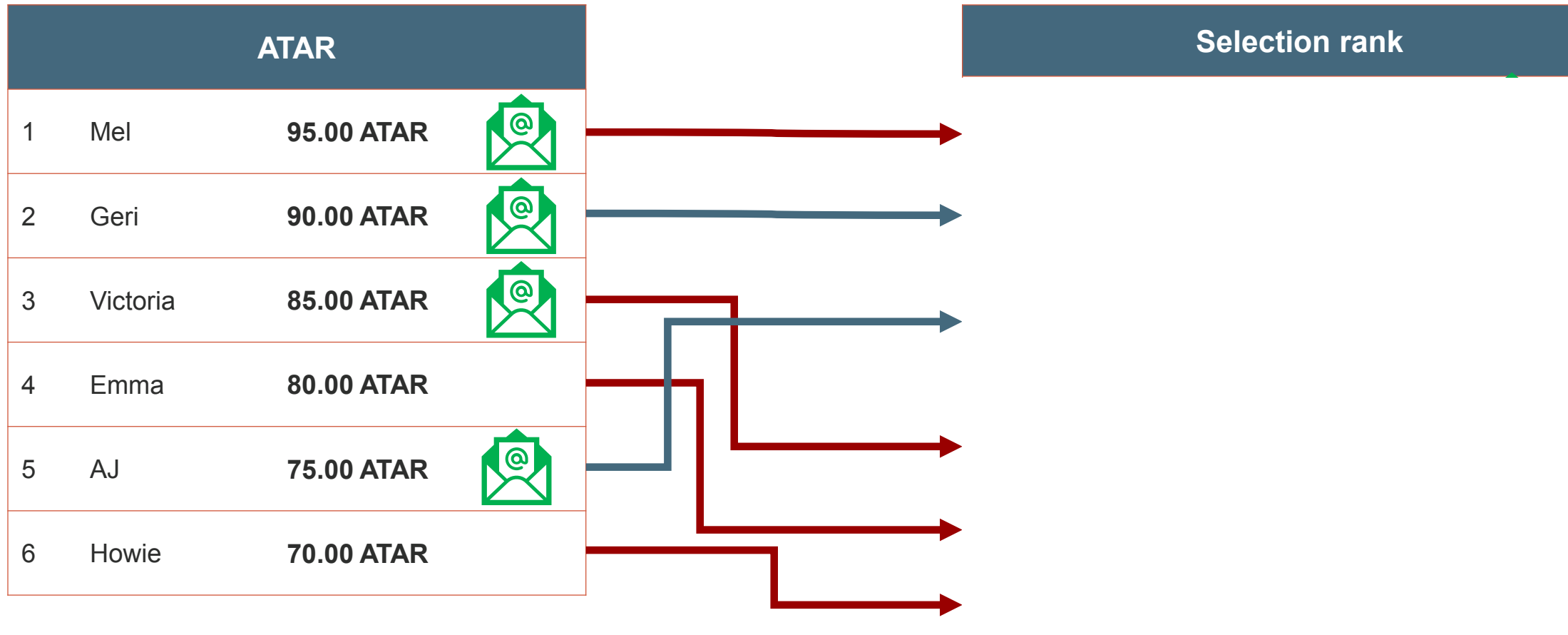

STEPS TO APPLY



Create a VTAC account

- All VTAC applications are completed online using the same VTAC ID and PIN
- Creating an account is a simple question-based process
- If you're a current Year 12 student, make sure you enter your student number so that we can access your results later in the year

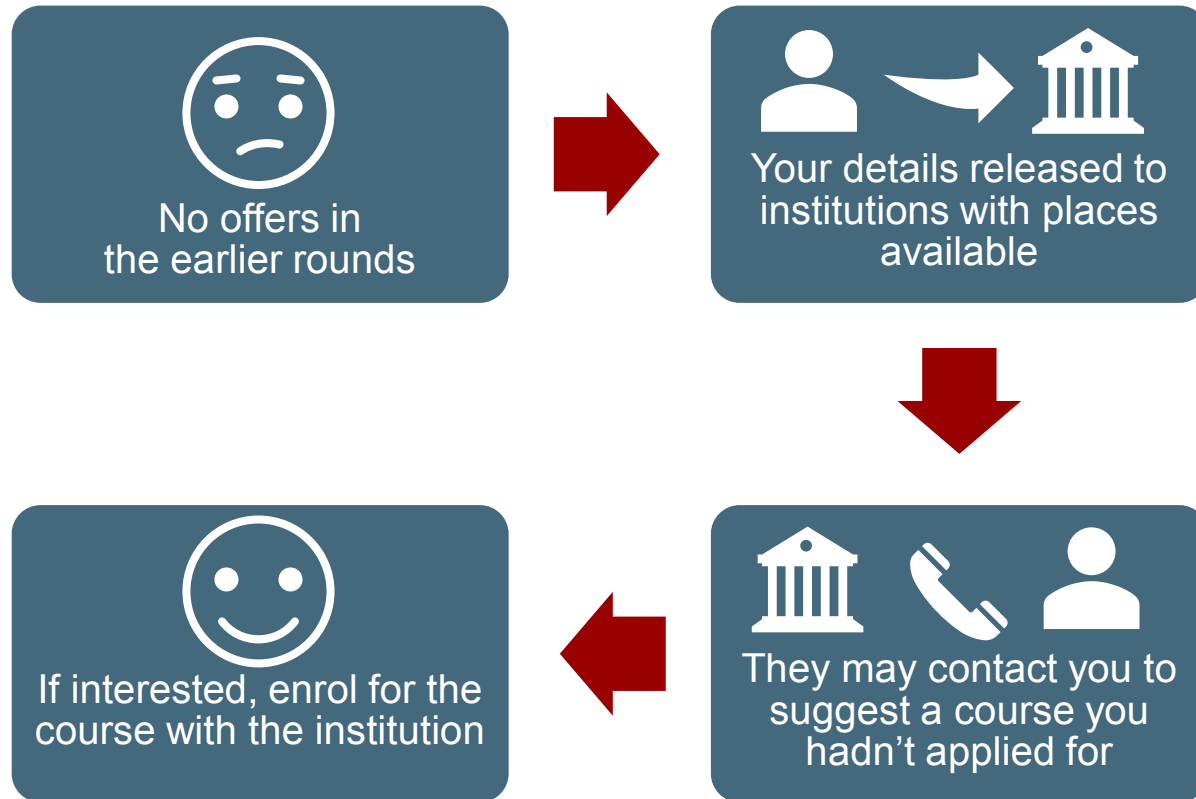

Change of Preference



- After applying, you can change your course preferences free-of-charge as many times as you like while Change of Preference is open
- Check the deadlines carefully prior to the start of each round
- The first deadline is for the December offer round, at 4pm on **Saturday 14 December 2019**
 - Get your preferences in the order you want by this date to maximise your chance of getting the offer you want







SEAS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

Special Entry Access Scheme (SEAS)

- SEAS is the special consideration program used by most institutions
- Filling out a single SEAS application will cover all of your eligible preferences
- Primarily for students who have suffered long-term disadvantage
 - **Except:** Category 1 (Personal Information and Location) – everyone should apply
- SEAS allows selection officers at institutions to grant special consideration for course entry to applicants.

What can SEAS do?

Applicants in ATAR order			
1	Mel	95.00 ATAR = 95.00 selection rank	
2	Geri	90.00 ATAR +subject adjustment = 94.00 selection rank	
3	Victoria	85.00 ATAR = 85.00 selection rank	
4	Emma	80.00 ATAR = 80.00 selection rank	
5	AJ	75.00 ATAR + SEAS + subject adjustment = 86.00 selection rank	
6	Howie	70.00 ATAR = 70.00 selection rank	

- SEAS does not exempt you from completing essential requirements and compulsory admission criteria.
 - You must study course prerequisites, attend all interviews, sit any required tests, and submit all required folios and forms.
- SEAS is not a guaranteed entry scheme or reserved quota, but may allow you to gain entry to a course with a lower ATAR than otherwise

SEAS categories

Category 1: Personal information and location

- As simple as ticking a box
- All applicants should apply for this category

Category 2: Disadvantaged financial background

Category 3: Disability or medical condition

Category 4: Difficult circumstances



Scholarships

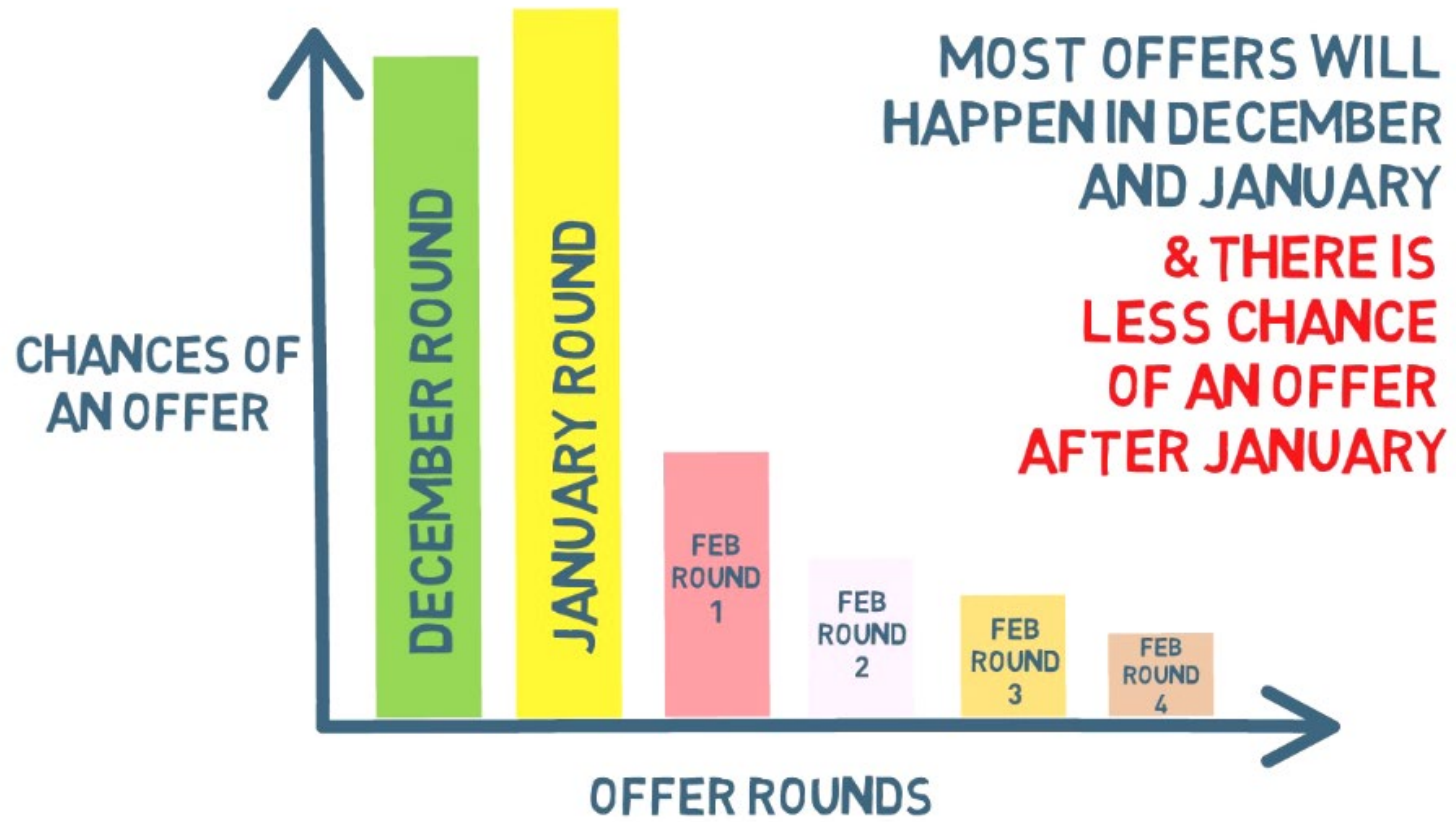
- VTAC collects scholarship applications for many institutions

- **Scholarships are not just for academic performance**
- Many equity scholarships have similar documentation requirements to SEAS
 - Statements must be submitted separately for each using the correct coversheet.

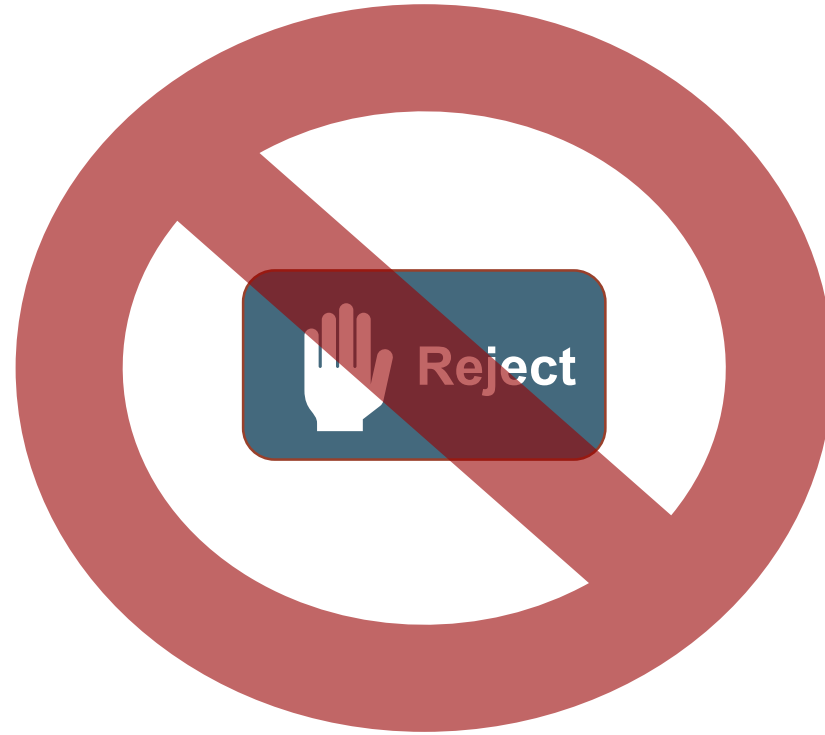

ATAR AND SCALING

Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR)

What is it?

- A tool for tertiary selection based on relative performance in the VCE
- It's a rank, not a score

How is it calculated?

- VTAC receives your study scores from VCAA and **scales** them for fairness
- Your **aggregate** is calculated from the highest permissible combination of your subjects
- The aggregates for everyone are placed in order for conversion to the **ATAR**, which is a percentile scale

Scaling



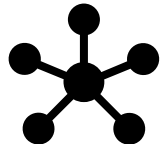
Why?

- Study scores received from the VCAA are a rank for that particular subject
- 30 is the average for every study, regardless of how competitive the cohort



How?


- By looking at the students undertaking the study this year, and their performance in their other studies




For what?

- Scaled scores are used only for the calculation of the ATAR
- Prerequisites and subject adjustments are based on raw study scores



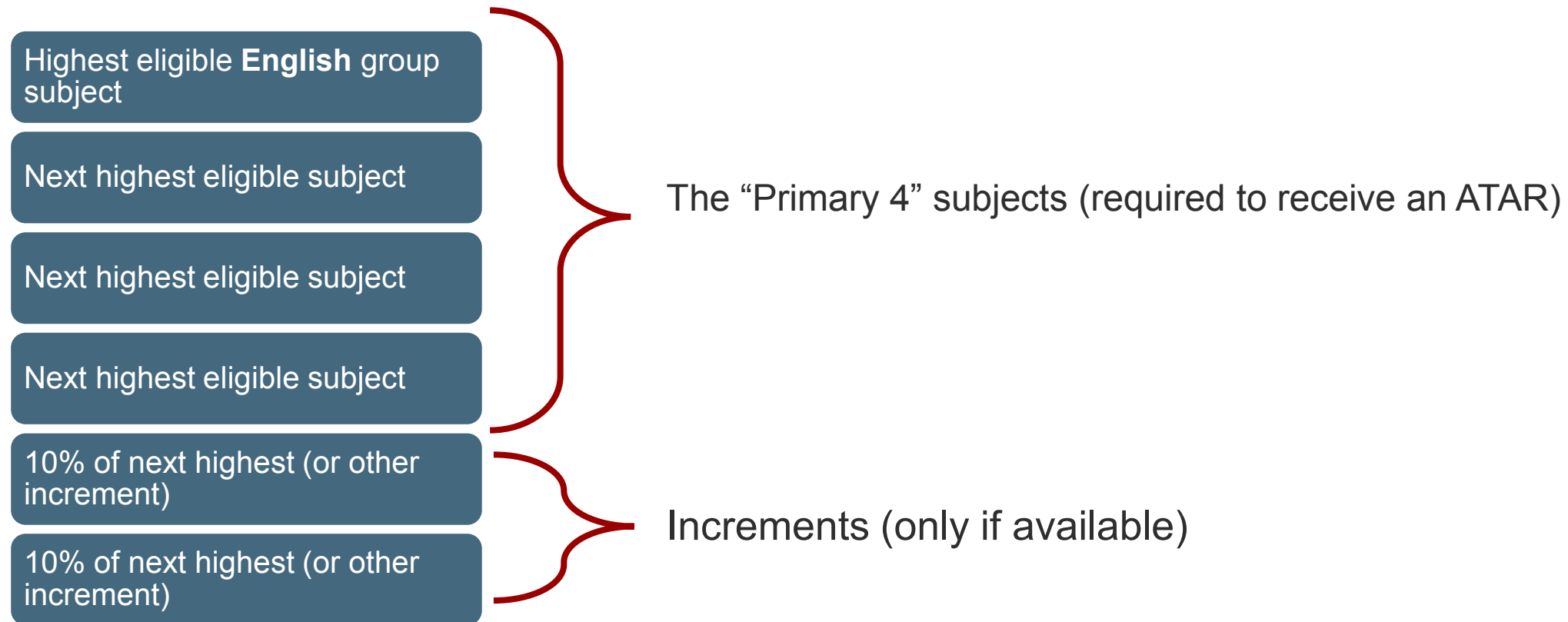

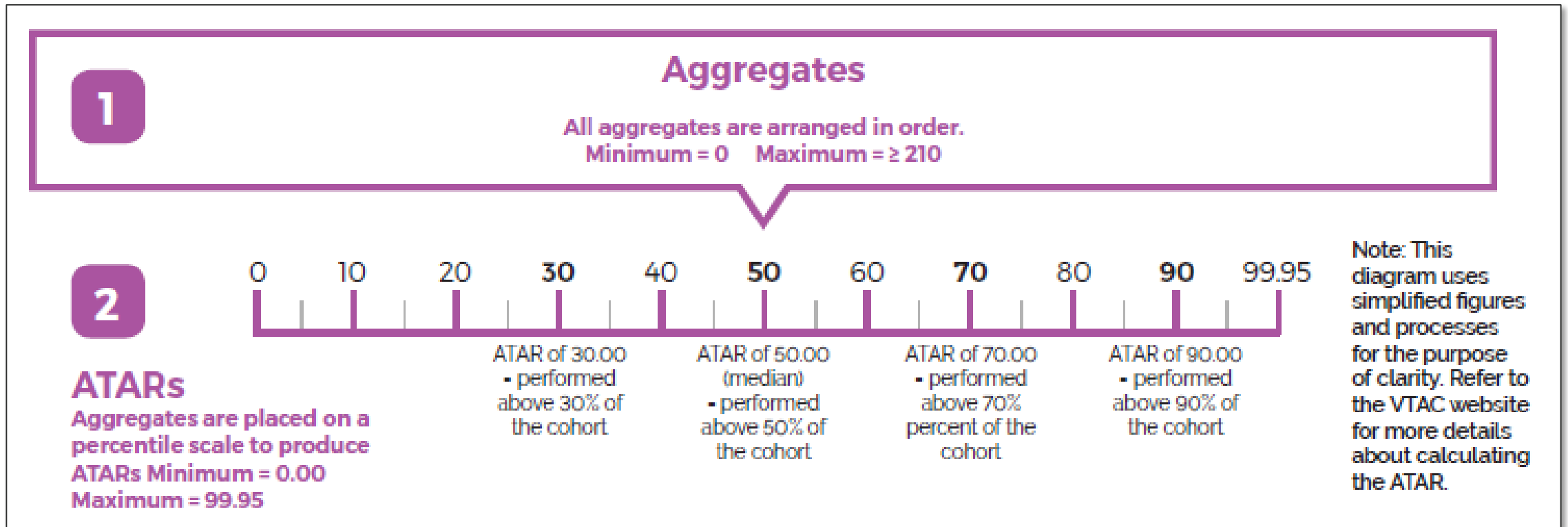
