### **SNAPSHOT OF FEDERATION UNIVERSITY**



- Federation University Australia was formed when the former University of Ballarat and the Gippsland Campus of Monash University were amalgamated
- FedUni's history actually dates back to 1870
- FedUni is regional Victoria's largest education institution, with <u>campuses</u> in Ballarat, Berwick, Gippsland, the Wimmera, and Brisbane providing easy access to study, and approximately 1200 staff committed to teaching excellence and student support
- FedUni has over 24,000 domestic and international students and 110,000 alumni across Australia and the world
- FedUni offers a broad range of <u>courses</u> from apprenticeships to bachelor degrees
- FedUni offers a range of <u>scholarships</u>, <u>bursaries and grants</u>. One particularly significant scholarship is the <u>FedUni High Achievers Scholarship</u> which is worth \$18,000 including one year of on-campus accommodation, for eligible students who attain an ATAR of 80+
- FedUni students can access a wide range of services and support to assist them
- Students who choose to live in residence gain the best start to their university experience <u>accommodation</u>. First-year undergraduate students are <u>guaranteed</u>\* accommodation during their first year of study

- <u>Bachelor of Performing Arts</u> This exciting *new* program replaces the highly regarded Bachelor of Music Theatre and Bachelor of Acting for Stage and Screen. This course will prepare students not only for a career as a performer, but also to become an active citizen of the world. Graduates will go on to work in television and theatre, music theatre, opera, film, cabaret, comedy, and multi-media performance. They will also go on to do creative things in the most surprising contexts both in Australia and internationally.

- Monash University's Peninsula Campus specialises in *nursing*, *physiotherapy*, *paramedicine*, *occupational therapy*, *education*, and *business administration* courses.
- There are approximately 4,500 students studying at the Peninsula Campus
- The Peninsula campus has a very <u>vibrant campus life</u> and is connected to the Clayton Campus through *free* shuttle buses that run between the campuses every day

Monash University offers an excellent <u>Diploma of Tertiary Studies</u> (DoTS) pathway program into a few of its undergraduate degrees. The pathway programs offered at the Peninsula Campus are:

**Diploma of Tertiary Studies – Business**: Upon successful completion of the DoTS - Business stream students can apply to enter into the <u>second year</u> of the Bachelor of Business Administration (Peninsula) OR the Bachelor of Business (Caulfield) depending upon their mathematics preparation, and their average marks in the DoTS program.

**Diploma of Tertiary Studies – Education:** Upon successful completion of the DoTS - Education stream students can apply to enter into the <u>second year</u> of the Bachelor of Education (Honours) in several specialisations.

**Diploma of Tertiary Studies – Nursing:** Upon successful completion of the DoTS - Nursing stream students can apply to enter into the <u>second year</u> of the Bachelor of Nursing.

### **BACHELOR OF OUTDOOR LEADERSHIP - VU**



VU's **Bachelor of Outdoor Leadership** prepares graduates for rewarding work - with a focus on building practical skills and industry connections. VU's partnership with **The Outdoor Education Group (OEG)**, gives paid internship opportunities for students, who work part time for the second and third year of their degrees as part of the internship stream. When students graduate, there is an exciting opportunity to apply for a two to three-year full-time contract with OEG.

### **BACHELOR OF ACCIDENT FORENSICS – CQ UNIVERSITY**



The **Accident Forensics** degree at CQU (Melbourne Campus) develops expertise in the investigation and analysis of the factors which lead to accidents and the interventions required to prevent their recurrence. Accident Forensics graduates demonstrate advanced skills at systematically breaking down the factors leading to an accident and making the necessary findings and conclusions for prevention. The course provides core studies in:

- Accident Phenomenology
- Investigation Methods
- Forensic Engineering
- Accident Analysis
- Human Factors Investigation
- Occupational Health and Safety


Students complete a capstone accident investigation project based on a 'real' accident reconstruction at the university 'crash lab'. There is a 120-hour work placement with practising accident investigators in the field ensuring students are well prepared to integrate into their chosen career. The course has been developed in consultation with Australia's leading accident investigation professionals from air, rail, road and industrial contexts, and the leading organisations and government authorities which inform public safety strategies.

### **INDUSTRY EMPLOYMENT SUMMARY**

In February this year, the Department of Employment released the trend in employment indicating that employment increased in nine industries and declined in 10 over the year to **February 2020**. Health Care and Social Assistance; Education and Training and Professional, Scientific and Technical Services made the largest contributions to employment growth. The largest falls in employment were recorded in Retail Trade, Other Services and Public Administration and Safety.

Employment in the **Agriculture, Forestry and Fishing** and **Manufacturing** industries is expected to continue to fall.
