The [Bachelor of International Business](#) is ideal for students wanting to launch an international career. Students have the opportunity to take part in immersive industry placements and study abroad as part of their degree.

This degree is a 2-year fast-track degree and provides students with an understanding of the issues affecting *international firms, including their strategy, policies, and operations*. The course equips students with the key economic, financial, political, legal, managerial, and strategic skills required for international business, putting students in a position to support businesses operating in an international economy.

The first year of the Bachelor of International Business is taught in the heart of the CBD at 271 Collins Street, while the second year is taught at the Caulfield campus.

New Bachelor of Data Science

Introduced in 2021, this degree students will build a practical understanding of recent developments in *computer science, information technology and statistics*, and be able to apply relevant mathematical and statistical knowledge and methods to new and ongoing problems. Students will develop their ability to analyse and manage large amounts of data from various sources and evaluate their insights and solutions.

Upon graduation, students will have the skills required to pursue a career as a *data scientist* in public and private organisations. The job titles may include *analytics specialist, business intelligence analyst or developer, data analyst, data architect, data engineer, data miner, data scientist, research scientist and web analyst*.

The VCE prerequisites for entry are Units 3 and 4: a study score of at least 30 in English (EAL)

➤ **New Certificate Courses**

Monash is offering two *new* 6-month certificate courses, taught wholly online, for students who might like to try a short course before entering the bachelor degree.

1. [University Certificate in Mental Health](#) – aimed at developing one's knowledge and skills in responding to mental health needs - from understanding mental illnesses, to different perspectives in mental health services, through to strategies for treatment and recovery. This course can lead towards further study, with the opportunity to progress into the [Bachelor of Health Sciences](#).
2. [Undergraduate Certificate of Sports and Exercise Nutrition](#) – provides participants with the scientific knowledge and practical skills to enhance their professional development in sport and exercise nutrition. This course can lead towards further study, with the opportunity to progress into the [Bachelor of Health Sciences](#) if students meet the course entry requirements.

➤ **Bachelor of Arts - Professional Futures**

The [Bachelor of Arts](#) at Monash University helps students achieve the career of their dreams by offering four *Professional Futures* domains which build the skills employers want. These domains are –

- ***Global Immersion*** — become engaged global citizens through overseas study.
- ***Intercultural expertise*** — navigate and successfully engage with different cultures.
- ***Professional experience*** — gain experience through internships and industry engagement.

- **Innovation capability** — prepare for the ever-changing workforce with skills in ethical and social innovation, leadership, and creativity.

Students get to choose from local and international internships, professional engagements, and entrepreneurial opportunities, and they have the choice of more than 50 global immersion programs including access to the funded Monash Arts Global Immersion Guarantee, preparing them to live and work in complex and culturally diverse environments, while building a community of like-minded peers.

Freight, Transport, and Logistics

An industry that is continuing to grow is in transport and logistics. There are many careers in this diverse industry from actually driving a truck or train, to being part of the logistics team involved in the planning and distribution of freight and people. A particularly important part of this industry is in *international freight* – be it freight coming into Australia (imports) from all over the world, or cargo being sent from Australia (exports). People involved in this do not move the freight themselves, but instead act as an agent, connecting exporters, importers, and various transportation services like shipping, air freight, road transport, and rail.

Event Planning Courses in Victoria in 2021

The information at [Good Universities Guide - Events](#) indicates that an **event planner** or **event coordinator** plans and organises special events, including parties, wedding

receptions, product launches, banquets, sporting events, meetings, conferences, and conventions. Successful event planners –

- enjoy working with people
- good organisational and time management skills
- have every attention to detail
- good interpersonal and supervisory skills
- good communication skills
- neat personal appearance
- comfortable working with computers
- able to negotiate, delegate and work under pressure

Depending on the size of the establishment, events coordinators may work independently or as part of a team. They often work irregular hours, and on weekends and public holidays.

The Good Universities Guide* states that *Human Resources Officers provide administration services for the recruitment and employment of staff. In small organisations, Human Resources Officers are usually responsible for all staffing matters. In large organisations they may specialise in a particular area such as recruitment, wages and entitlements or staff training.*

Personal requirements of a Human Resources Officer -

- Good planning, organisational, analytical and decision-making skills
- Good oral and written communication skills
- Tactful and discrete when dealing with people and confidential information
