Curriculum Structure Year 10 2023

Compulsory Units of Study



In Year 10 all students study core units from:

- English (all year)
- Mathematics (all year)
- Religious Education (all year)
- Health & Physical Education (one semester)

They also complete a Personal Project as part of MYP Requirements for final year (Year 5) of IB/MYP





IN ADDITION, STUDENTS MUST SELECT 9 ELECTIVE UNITS FROM A RANGE OF CHOICES FROM GROUP A & GROUP B SUBJECTS


This selection must include at least one unit from each of the following domains:


- Humanities
- Interdisciplinary Unit (IDU)
- Languages Other Than English (LOTE) Chinese or French
- Science
- Any remaining choices can be selected from any Domain area.
- If an accelerated VCE and/or a VCE LOTE pathway is chosen, then this counts as two Year 10 elective options in the Group A subject elective group.
- Students may choose other elective subjects of their choice from the Group B subject elective options.


- Essential Mathematics for those who find Mathematics challenging










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LOTE (French or Chinese)



Students continue with the LOTE studied in Year 9.

French:

- All students will continue French for 1 semester
- A student considering the possibility of VCE French is strongly encouraged to select the French VCE Pathway - 2 semesters

Chinese-Mandarin:

- All students will select VET Certificate II (Mandarin) 1 Semester
- Students can elect to start Certificate III in Semester 2 and complete the Certificate when in Year 11.

This will count as completion of VCE Units 3&4 and contributes towards their ATAR.







What if I just don't know?


If you have no idea which studies you want to take up after school, don't panic! Keep your Year 10 study program broad across different studies and go back to basics: What you love doing, what you are interested in.



How VET is Structured



- Usual entry is at Year 11
- Some students commence their VET program in Year 10 as an Accelerated VCE Study and this subject counts for 2 Group A elective units
- Students work through modules with outcomes being assessed for competency
- Assessment is based on students being able to perform tasks and demonstrate skills linked to a specific industry



Course Expectations



- Additional costs are incurred with VET subjects
- External VET courses will require students to travel to a different venue to complete the course
- Many courses have extended hours
- VET subjects require students to utilise their organisational skills







- Complete Mater Christi subject selection process and include VET enrolment form
- If the application is accepted, students are enrolled in the VET subject of choice and will receive email confirmation of this. Parents will receive further information at a later stage


Acceleration into a VCE Study

Accelerated VCE Study - is it for me?



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- Year 10 students may apply to complete a Year 11 / Unit 1&2 VCE subject
- Helps maximise their performance, work habits and academic achievement
- Provides an excellent experience for students capable of advanced study
- There are several VCE subjects that would be suitable for *highly able students* to select (see p.5 of the Curriculum Guide).
- A VET course may be undertaken as an Accelerated VCE Study and will count as a VCE Unit 1&2 subject as well as developing skills for future employment
- Students use their two free choices in Group A to undertake an Accelerated VCE Study
- Students need to demonstrate that they meet the selection criteria



Selection Criteria & Application Process




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Highly able students who wish to apply for acceleration must show clear evidence to meet the following criteria:

- *Strong* attendance record that meets VCE requirements
- Strong academic results (minimum overall grade of 5 in a MYP related subject group)
- Highly motivated, strong organisational skills and sound work habits
- Complete <u>Acceleration Application form</u> with a supporting statement and submitted with Subject Selection/Reenrolment form by Friday 12 August

It is a condition of enrolling in acceleration subject/s in Units 1-2 that students are doing so to maximise their options beyond Year 12 by studying a total of **six Unit 3-4** sequences over two years.
