Manage Your Projects

- ② It manages all your projects in one place & shows you all the information in a Gantt Chart view making progress easier to track.

- O SharePoint also allows you to share a same file with your team. Changes made to the file by everyone can be saved.

Get Alerts

- When there's a change on the site (someone uploads daily report, applies for a leave, completes a task, etc.), you will get an email. So you simply need to check your email in order to keep yourself updated.
- No more phone calls to get the latest update.
- ② You can set up Alerts for yourself for a particular item, file, folder, list or a document library.

No special training is required to use SharePoint. Anyone who knows to work with Internet Explorer and Outlook can work on SharePoint. And there are no special hardware requirements. Just a computer with at least 2GB-4GB of RAM.

What Does It Cost?

Operationally Mature Cloud-Providers typically charge on a "per-user" basis, ranging from \$70 to \$350 per user per month. The main variables affecting per user price include the types of applications, data storage/size requirements, data retention periods, security measures, complexity of your environment, services that are bundled with cloud computing power, number of servers, availability of multiple data centers, disaster recovery options, and compliance levels. The fixed-fee approach makes pricing transparent and monthly bills predictable.

Other cloud providers price on a "per-user-plus-cost" model that includes the above variables plus other costs. The "plus costs" may include items such as bandwidth usage, power consumption, cooling requirements, failover capabilities and number of multiple Internet Service Providers available. These built in provider-based "safety valves" make it difficult for companies to calculate usage and, therefore, their monthly costs. "Plus costs" can vary greatly from month to month, bringing unpredictability to your monthly cloud computing bill.

opportunities that others only dreamed of because he had strong convictions about his beliefs, right and wrong. I can tell you – that after you have sweated blood and tears for a personal passion – it's hard to say "No" to opportunities, but I applaud Mike for staying "True Blue" to his values. In doing so, the "right opportunities" presented themselves. He showed that one can fulfill their dreams and stay true to one's core and central values.

- Being Told No Is An Opportunity. Mike pitched his TV series countless times and faced too many rejections to count. Instead of giving up, he used these moments as opportunities to improve and better his game. He said that "No often simply means not right now not No forever." Taking this outlook, he pressed on and eventually the right opportunities presented themselves.
- ② Tapping Into Your Alternative Energy. As Mike shared his story, it became very apparent that he is extremely open minded. HIPAA Brief: Why You Shouldn't Use Webmail or Text Messages for Patient Info

Definition:

Webmail includes the free mail services available on the Internet, like Gmail, Yahoo! Mail, Hotmail, etc. plus free e-mail accounts you receive with Internet service from Verizon, AT&T, Comcast, and others. Text messages include the services from cell carriers like Verizon, AT&T, T-Mobile, Sprint, and others.

These services are free & so easy. So why is it a bad idea to use them?

Free webmail services are not secure methods of communication. While they may be fine for personal messages, they do not include the security required to communicate protected information, including medical records and lab and test results. Even e-mail messages you send to someone else in your office goes outside to the free webmail service and then back. Text messages are never deleted by the cell phone carriers. The recent scandals involving the media prove that text messages can be hacked. The companies that offer these services typically will not sign Business Associate Agreements required for any organization that stores patient information, including any messages or attachments containing Protected Health Information (PHI.)

What happens if we use webmail or text messages to communicate patient information?

In 2012 a small medical practice was using webmail to communicate patient information. They were also using an online calendar to schedule patient appointments. The practice was fined \$100,000 and had to pay for notification costs for patients whose data was breached. It also had to implement secure communications and undergo a Corrective Action Plan to address their underlying lack of HIPAA compliance.

So what should we do?

Immediately stop sending patient information by webmail or text messages.

- Use faxing or other methods to communicate patient data. You should not use a system that converts faxes to e-mail messages sent through a webmail account.
- It is less expensive and easier now than ever to implement a Cloud-based secure e-mail system for communicating within your practice. Communicating patient information to anyone outside of your practice should be done using e-mail encryption.
- Use an Electronic Health Records (EHR) system. It likely includes a portal through which you can securely communicate with patients.
- ② Subscribe to an **e-mail encryption** service that secures sensitive data. Instead of receiving an e-mail containing protected information, your recipient receives an e-mail inviting them to log into a secure site to retrieve the protected information. All they get is a message to log-in; no protected information is ever sent.
- Text messages should be replaced by voice calls as long as any voice message you leave is not converted to an e-mail or text message through an unsecure service.

up on new technology.





(October 25, 2001-April 8, 2014)

Dearly beloved, we are gathered here to say farewell to a dear old friend,



April 8, 2014, officially signifies the end of life for Windows XP. Launched in 2001, predating 9/11, Windows XP instantly became a huge hit, unable to be toppled later by Windows Vista (by most) and even Windows 7 and 8 (by many). The operating system was still being installed on some new computers as recently as 2010.

An Urgent Security Warning For Any Business Still Running Windows XP

If your organization is currently running Windows XP on one or more computers in your office (29% of all PC operating systems were Windows XP as of the beginning of this year), you need to be aware that you are exposing your computer network to a dangerous security threat that must be addressed immediately.

With the retirement of Windows XP as of April 8, no further security updates, patches or system updates will be released to protect you from viruses, malware, spyware, crashes or theft of personal information. That means your computer network could very soon be completely exposed to serious hacker attacks aimed at taking control of your network, stealing data, crashing your system and inflicting a host of other business-crippling problems you do NOT want to deal with. If you have even one XP computer on your network, then you are at risk!
