



## ASEAN Economic Community (AEC)

#### **ASEAN's Opportunity to Enhance Intra-Regional Trade**

- 1. Intra-ASEAN trade around 27% huge opportunity to increase. Intra-EU trade well above 70%.
- 2. ASEAN Economic Community Blueprint 2025 highly integrated economies and enhanced ASEAN Connectivity in the ASEAN Economic Community Vision 2025
- 3. AEC 2025 foresees:
  - Deeper integration in trade in services;
  - Seamless movement of investment;
  - Enhanced participation in global value chains;
  - Enhance mechanisms to attract foreign direct investments





## **ASEAN** Connectivity

An efficient and integrated transport system to support the AEC and improve competitiveness is the ultimate objective

- Operationalize transport facilitation agreements





#### Most of the milestones of transport integration are still in progress





## Key challenges

#### Cross-border procedures for road transport has scope for more integration and liberalisation

#### Setting:



- Critical for ASEAN integration and competitiveness
- Sub-regional initiatives provide opportunity to stay ahead of the curve: CLMVT
- Road transport is faster than sea and cheaper than air, but is under-utilized
- Harmonization and mutual recognition to achieve seamless transports
- Transit procedures not harmonised and streamlined
  - $\checkmark$  Vehicle and rail standards
  - ✓ Cabotage
  - ✓ Customs documentation
- Visa requirements and immigration procedures for truck drivers



## Trade and transport facilitation in Thailand

## Thailand is consistently improving in major global rankings but addressing problematic issues is a priority to enhance competitiveness

WEF Enabling Trade Index	<ul> <li>Ranked 57 (2014)</li> <li>Domestic market access at lower end of ranking</li> <li>Access to input goods problematic</li> </ul>	• Ranked <b>57</b> (2012)
World Bank Logistics Performance Index	<ul> <li>Ranked <b>35</b> (2014)</li> <li>Improvements on all categories</li> <li>But consistently behind Malaysia in the ranking</li> </ul>	• Ranked <b>38</b> (2012)

#### **Solution**

ASEAN economic integration requires a comprehensive approach and bold decisions

- Political will and trust
- More holistic view of trade facilitation and the role of foreign investment
- Partnership with industry
- Gap analysis vis-à-vis implementation of ASEAN agreements: business point of view
- Accelerate sub-regional initiatives in the Mekong region (e.g. CBTA)



#### Way forward

Ambitious implementation of ASEAN Customs Transit System and the Cross Border Transit Agreement (GMS-CBTA)

Gap analysis vis-à-vis implementation of ASEAN agreements Enhance ASEAN integration to support Thailand's competitiveness

Commitment to ASEAN Logistics Roadmap

Partnership with industry

Implementation of ASEAN aviation agreements



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#### Concluding remarks



Logistics is a key competitive advantage for manufacturing

Hard infrastructure is important to support physical connectivity but policy changes and trade facilitation are as important to provide for a competitive and efficient logistics chain

Better regional connectivity will improve ASEAN's resilience and competitiveness

Improving supply chain performance requires coordination across many government agencies and collaboration with industry

Mapping of necessary changes to current legal framework: involve industry

Commitment to ASEAN Transport Strategic Plan, full implementation of GMS Cross-Border Transit Agreement
