Just because you don't own a "smartphone" doesn't mean it's dumb! Here are a few helpful tips to expand the features of a basic cell phone (note...regular text message rates still apply):

Use text messages to send/ receive status updates on social networks such as Facebook. Visit your account settings page and select "register for Facebook text messages" under the mobile tab. This will enable you to receive texts for friend requests, messages, wall posts, and your friends' status updates, as well as update your own status via text message. Beware on your birthday...when you'll be bombarded with wellwishers on your big day!

Send a text to a landline.

Your message will be converted into a computerized voice recording that can even leave a message on voicemail if no one answers.

Get weather. Text your zip code or city and two-letter state abbreviation to The Weather Channel (42278 or 78676).

Search Google via texting. Text GOOGLE (466453) with your search query and you will receive results via text. Simply start your text with search information.

Retrieve directions without a GPS. Text GOOGLE (466453) your starting address, followed by "to" and your destination address.

Adding an Extra Hour to Your Day

Replace Old PCs—While it's difficult to estimate how much total time is wasted waiting on an old, sluggish computer to start up and process tasks...it does add up! If your old PC takes 10 seconds longer to process a task, and a typical user averages 100-150 tasks a day...that's 16-25 minutes of wasted time each day. Add the crashes and other problems old PCs cause and you're closer to 30-35 minutes a day per employee!

Maintain Your Network-

Diligent updating, patching and optimizing your server and workstations is key! You'd be surprised how much slower even a new machine will start to run if not maintained properly.

Manage Your Documents —

Scanning and storing paper documents so they can be searched and located in seconds rather than minutes or hours is a HUGE time saver. Plus, it's a greener solution, improves document security, enables users to access critical documents remotely and prevents important papers from loss or damage.

Keep Files at Your Fingertips



Keeping the files on your computer organized and up-to-date is critical. The goal of computer file management is to ensure that you can find what you're looking for, even if it was filed years ago. The following file management tips will help you keep your files at your fingertips:

Create Folders

These are the drawers of your computer's file cabinet, so to speak. Use plain language to name your folders.

Nest Folders Within Folders

Create other folders within these main folders as needed. IT Radix recommends that clients use the same filing structure for their documents as they do for their email (e.g., a "clients" folder and then individual clients below).

Follow Consistent File Naming Conventions

Be specific—give files logical, identifiable names and include dates if possible. The goal when naming files is to be able to tell what the file is about without having to open it (for example, 2011.01.01.Capstone Agreement Company). Placing the date at the beginning of the filename forces files to be listed chronologically.

Cull Files Regularly

Keep your folders uncluttered by clearing out old files. Do <u>not</u> delete business-related files unless you are absolutely certain that you will never need the file again. Instead, create a folder called "Archive" and move old files into it when you come across them.

File as You Go

The best time to file a document is when you first create it. So, get in the habit of using the "Save As" dialogue box to save it in the correct place right off the bat.

Back Up Your Files Regularly

Not only is it important to set up and follow a regular back up regime, but it's imperative to periodically check to confirm that backups are indeed working successfully.

Change Notification/Icons

The notification area is located at the far right of the taskbar, and it contains program icons that provide status and notifications about things like incoming email, updates, and network connectivity. This area can be customized to include useful icons and notifications

Customize desktop gadgets

Desktop gadgets (e.g., calendar, clock, feed headlines, etc.) can be customized by changing their settings, size and position on the desktop, as well as displaying them on top of other windows.

Theme

A theme is a combination of pictures, colors, and sounds on your computer. It includes a desktop background, screen saver, window border color, and sound scheme. Some themes might also include desktop icons and mouse pointers. Windows comes with several themes. The Windows 7 Basic theme is great for computers that perform slowly, a high-contrast theme makes the items on your screen easier to see, or an Aero theme can be chosen to personalize the computer.



Desktop Background

The desktop background (also called Wallpaper) can be a personal digital picture, corporate logo, picture that comes with Windows, solid color, or picture framed with a color. One image can be displayed in the background or a slide show of pictures.
