Required Preparation for Your Colonoscopy-EXTRA -AM

Nulytely/Trilyte/Colyte--AM Prep and AM Half Prep

Start Planning FIVE DAYS BEFORE Your Scheduled Colonoscopy:

If you have <u>diabetes</u> or take <u>blood thinners</u> (Coumadin, Plavix, Ticlid, Aspirin, etc.) <u>and did not tell the doctor</u>, *inform the doctor immediately*. Generally you should stop medications, or vitamins containing Iron, Vitamin E, Fish Oil, Garlic Tablets, Ginko Biloba, ginseng or Aspirin-like products (Advil, Motrin, Aleve, Nuprin, Alka-Seltzer, Naprosyn, etc.) for 5 days prior to the procedure. However, you will be specifically instructed about withholding Aspirin, Plavix and Coumadin according to your medical situation.

YOU MAY TAKE TYLENOL AS NEEDED FOR A HEADACHE OR PAIN. TAKE YOUR REGULAR MEDICATION APPROVED BY YOUR DOCTOR WITH A SIP OF WATER.

Two Days Before the Colonoscopy:

Do not eat any fruits, nuts, vegetables, salads, seeds, berries or whole grains. *This is essential in order to successfully clear your colon for the procedure.*

Two Days Before the Colonoscopy:

Take 2 Dulcolax tablets (purchase over the counter) at bedtime with 8 oz of water.

ONE DAY BEFORE PROCEDURE:

- 1. Mix *liquid with water* early in the day. Shake the container well and put in it the refrigerator.
- 2. Have liquids all day. Clear liquids include juice (apple or white grape), soft drinks, jello, broth and tea. **AVOID MILK AND SOUPS,**
- 3. NOTHING RED OR ORANGE IN COLOR.
- 4. At noon take (2) DULCOLAX tablets (purchased over the counter) with 8 oz of water, soda or juice.
- 5. At 4pm and 5pm drink 8 oz of water.
- 6. At 6:30pm start NULYTELY/TRILYTE/COLYTE. Drink 1/3 cup every 5 minutes. Finish drinking by 10pm.
- 7. You may not have a BM until you are more then half way done. If you have taken most of the medication with no BM or develop pain you may use a fleet enema to induce a BM.
- 8. At 10pm or when you are finished with the NULYTELY/TRILYTE/COLYTE, take (2) DULCOLAX tablets.
- 9. You may have small amounts of clear liquids until midnight.

DAY OF PROCEDURE:

- 1. TAKE YOUR HEART MEDICATIONS OR BLOOD PRESSURE MEDICATIONS WITH A SIP OF WATER AT LEAST FOUR (4) HOURS PRIOR TO YOUR PROCEDURE.
- 2. **DO NOT EAT OR DRINK ANYTHING** EXCEPT FOR YOUR MEDICATIONS APPROVED BY YOUR DOCTOR THE MORNING OF YOUR PROCEDURE WITH A SIP OF WATER.

PREPARATION MUST BE COMPLETED 4 HOURS PRIOR TO YOUR PROCEDURE TIME
