1 - Smoke Alarm Analogy

Age: All ages

To explain what anxiety is, I use the smoke alarm analogy. Smoke alarms are helpful for alerting us to danger when there's a fire and we need to get out of the building. But sometimes smoke alarms go off even when there isn't a big danger, like when we burn popcorn or toast. It makes the same sound for big emergency fires or little non-emergency fires. Anxiety does the same thing. Anxiety tells us there's a big danger, even if the situation is not that big. It feels like a big danger because anxiety sends the same signals. The good news is we can learn skills to tame that anxiety emergency alarm (no more burnt toast alarms!).

2 - Hey Warrior

Age: Elementary & Middle School


The Two Pilots from Two Different Universes

The little pilot could rejoin his family and go back home to his universe!


