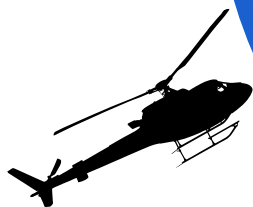
AEROMODELLING WORKSHOP

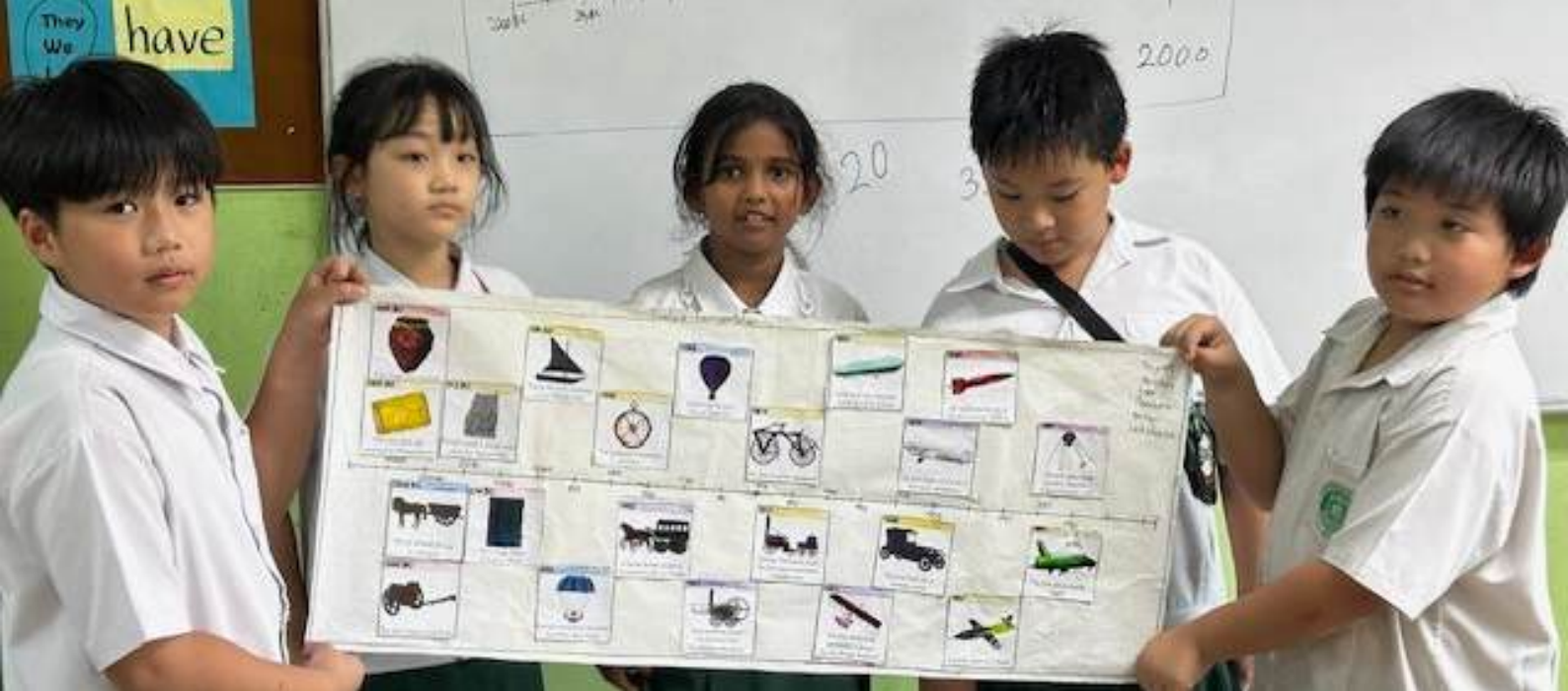

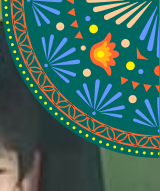
