





The corresponding points of winners will be added to their Houses points and be announced at the end of this 2nd semester. The judging and selection process was done last May 5, 2025, by Mr. James and Mrs. Farzana, the selected work of winners was displayed on the assembly area.



AI Workshop

AITIS along with Delegates from University Putra Malaysia arranged an AI workshop for Grade 5 on 16th May, 2025.

Students were divided into 3 tracks, i.e. 9 students per track. Throughout the duration of the program, students would sit in one track, and then students would be required to move to another track after 45 minutes. Each track had been designed to include at least 4-5 different fun, child-friendly activities.



Track 1: Artificial Intelligence and Internet-of-Things (Computer Lab)

This program is designed to introduce the exciting world of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Internet of Things (IoT). AI is a part of computer science that focuses on creating smart systems that can think, learn, and solve problems like humans. Through this program, the students have been exposed to basic AI concepts exploration in a fun and interactive way.



There were also hands-on activities using cool tools like Generative AI, Quick Draw, and Teachable Machine to help students understand how AI works and how it can be used in real life. This session offered interactive demonstrations of Internet of Things (IoT) technologies and robotics through the use of Microbit, which provided the participants with hands-on experiences to better understand how IoT systems function and their practical applications in the modern world.


Teamwork makes the dream work.




In terms of appearance, I am a large, long-eared hare with dark gray fur. My ears and hind feet are almost the same length.

Okapi: The Forest Giraffe's Life

The okapi is a rare mammal from the Congo rainforest and the closest relatives of the giraffe, which is why it's called the "forest giraffe." It has zebra-like tongue, and giraffe-like features. Unique for its shy nature and forest lifestyle, the okapi is the only other member of the Giraffidae family. Studying it helps with conservation, understanding ecosystems, and evolution.


The okapi has a dark brown body, white zebra-like stripes on its legs, large ears, a long neck, and a blue-black tongue. Its stripes provide camouflage in forest light, and its ears detect predators. Okapis are smaller, but share features like ossicones and long tongue.

The okapi lives in the Ituri Rainforest in the Congo, preferring dense, tropical forest. This habitat offers camouflage, food, water, and protection from predators.

The okapi eats leaves, fruits, and fungi, using its long tongue to grab food. It finds food with a strong sense of smell in dense forest.

Okapis are nocturnal and solitary, resting during the day to avoid predators. At night, they feed on plants and groom themselves.

Thanks to strong teamwork among teachers, flexible planning, and a focus on student needs, our summer class was a memorable and successful experience.



