




CHILDREN'S DAY




ELEMENTARY SECTION

CAN YOU TELL THE DIFFERENCE?

Most of us didn't learn these things in school. We learned them through awkward moments, silent corrections, and growing up.

So if you're a parent, consider this your gentle reminder:

Manners aren't about being strict – they're about raising confident, respectful humans who know how to move through the world with ease.

These are the small habits that quietly shape how your child is perceived, treated, and remembered.

01- Stand up to greet someone, especially elders: Standing up shows respect, confidence, and good upbringing. It makes the other person feel valued.

02- Ask about others before talking about yourself: It shows empathy and interest. People remember how you made them feel-not what you said about yourself.

03 Walk beside people not ahead of them: Walking together shows respect, patience, and awareness. Rushing ahead sends a message that your time matters more than theirs.

04- Don't point at people: Pointing can feel rude or embarrassing. Teach them to use words instead-it builds sensitivity and social awareness.

05- Remember names and use them: Using someone's name shows attention, effort, and respect. It makes people feel seen and important.

06- Listen fully before you speak: Good manners start with listening. Interrupting shows impatience; listening shows maturity.

07- Maintain eye contact when shaking hands: Eye contact signals confidence, honesty, and presence. It creates a strong first impression.

08 Let people exit before you enter: This shows patience and consideration. It also keeps spaces calm and organized.

09 Say "thank you" and "sorry" without being prompted: These words show accountability and gratitude. Real manners don't need reminders.

10 Wait for everyone to be served before eating: It teaches patience and respect, especially in social or family settings.







The next morning, we went outside for a walk and noticed something strange—a metal door standing alone near the street. It was a time machine.


