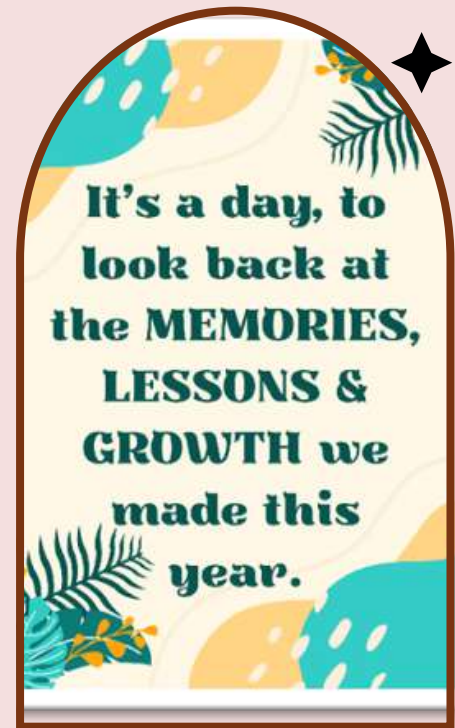
AITIS MISSION STATEMENT

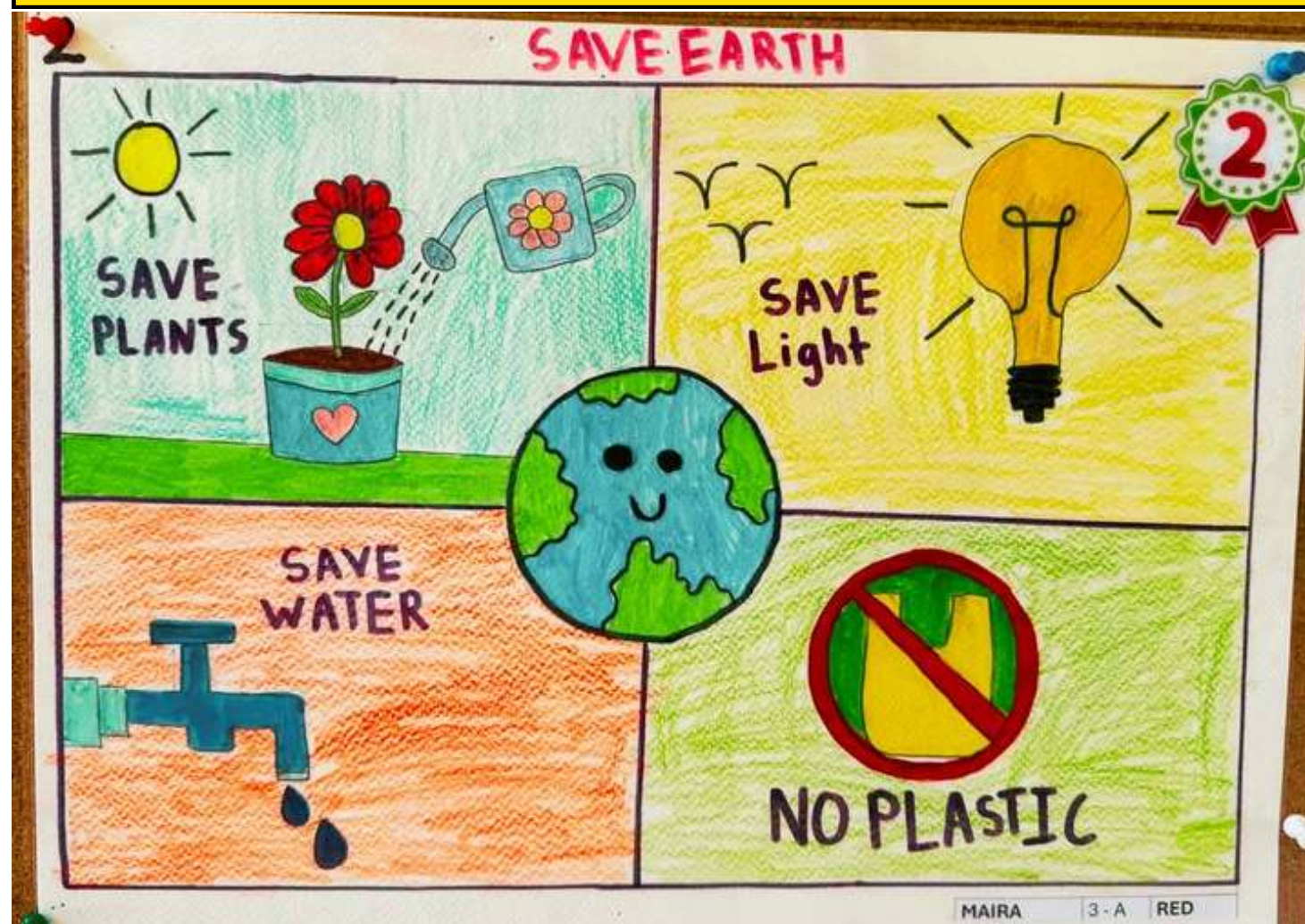

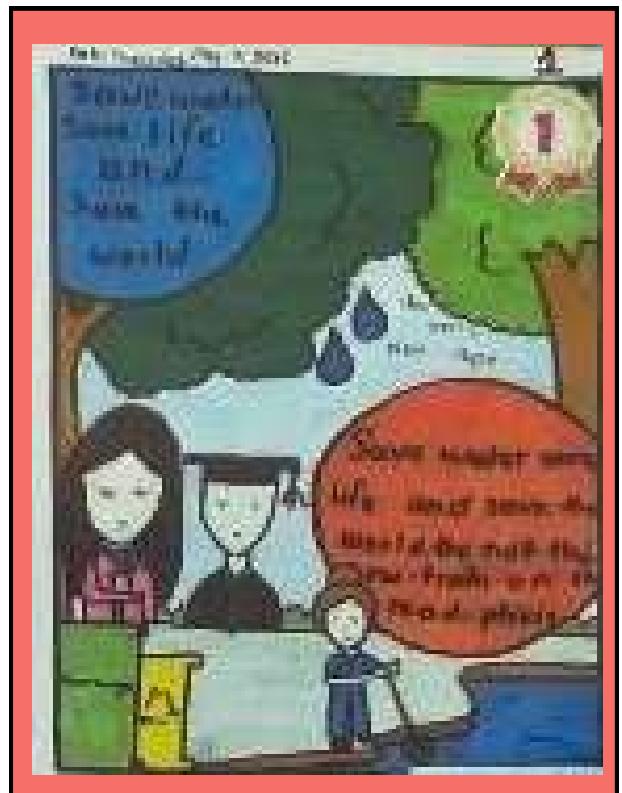

To the juniors coming up behind us. Don't rush it.

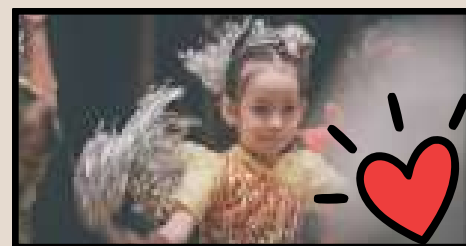
Make mistakes: This is the best place to fail and learn.

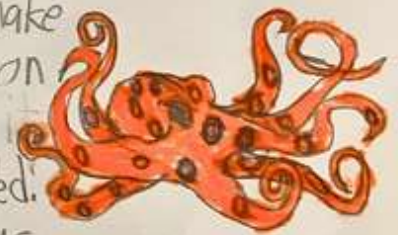
Mimic Octopus

This octopus can make blue rings appear on its skin whenever it feels threatened. It is also poisonous.

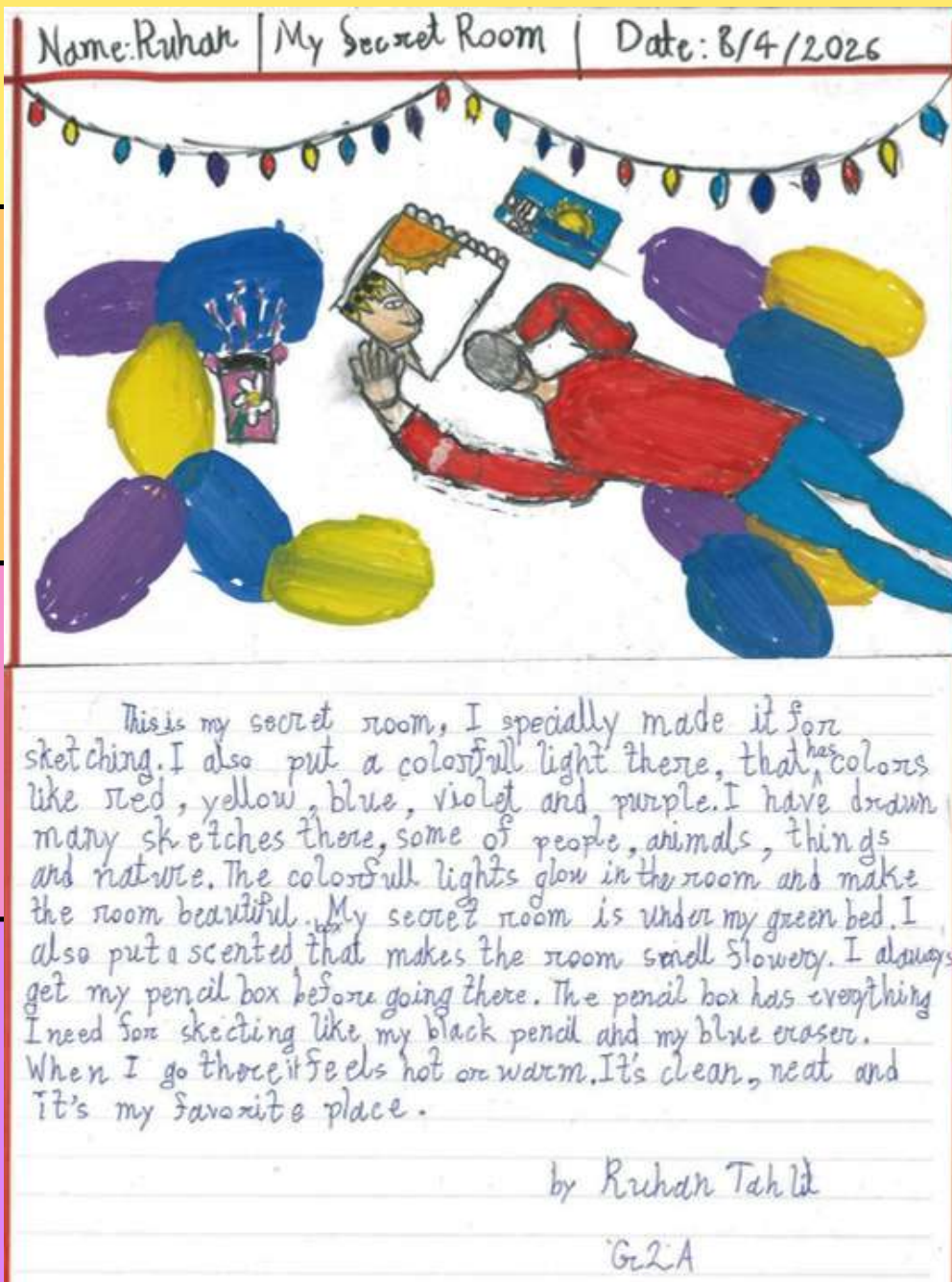


Giant Pacific Octopus

MOVIE

I watched Pocahontas I and II, which were made by The Walt Disney Company in 1995 and 1998, respectively. The main characters were Pocahontas (a Powhatan tribal girl), John Smith, John Rolfe, Governor Ratcliffe, and Chief Powhatan.

In the first movie, a group of English settlers sailed to North America, which was known as the New World. Governor Ratcliffe led the settlers and was rich and powerful. When John Smith met Pocahontas, they became friends. Conflict arose, and John Smith was captured and was about to be executed, but Pocahontas stopped the execution. Disney's Jamestown was shown as successful, while the real Jamestown was filled with starvation and disease. The movie was not historically accurate.

In real life, she was only 10–12 years old when the settlers arrived. He was the second governor, and he focused more on survival than on finding gold. He also worked with John Smith. Pocahontas' real name was Matoaka, not "Pocahontas."

The movies were emotional, funny, and entertaining, and they could spark interest in history, but many of the facts about Jamestown were inaccurate. Although the movies were enjoyable, real history was more important.

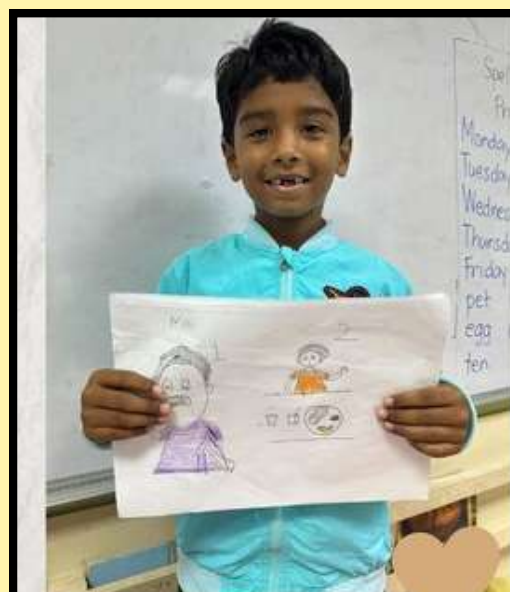

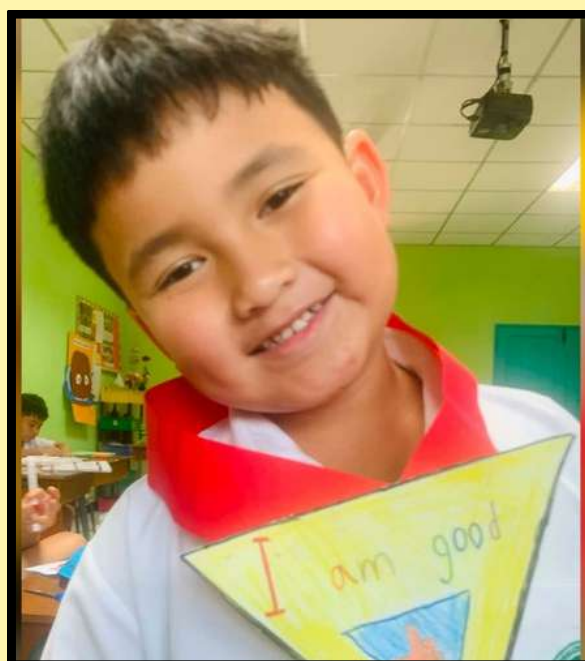

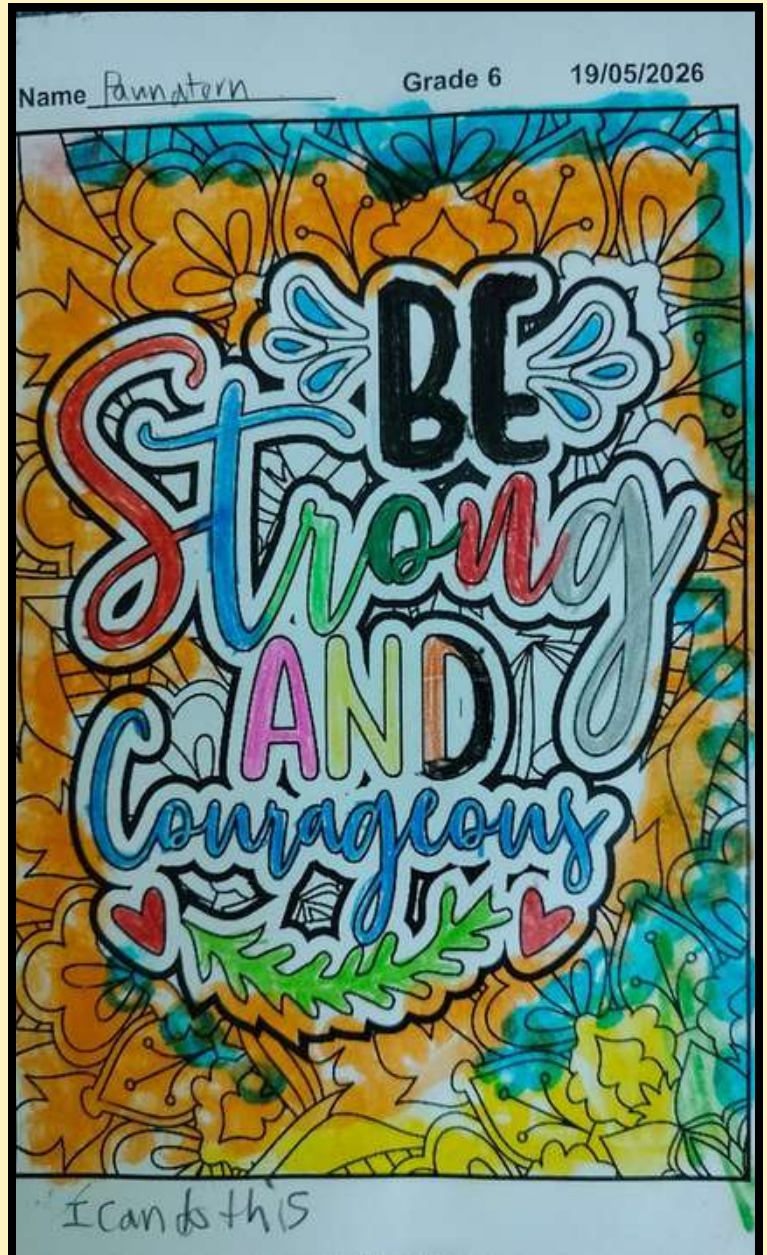
