 - a) Assistant Principal Evelyn Giamadakis completed Principal Paniagua's one-month entry plan in two weeks.

 - i) The school was rated "Well Developed" in all categories.
 - ii) Only 1% of schools receive that for all categories.
 - g) RULER
 - i) On Tuesday, Principal Paniagua went to the United Nations for a session on RULER.
 - ii) The school will pursue excellence in social-emotional learning with the same dedication as excellence in academics.
 - iii) Peer mediators for RULER in the P.A. meeting today.
 - iv) The Blueprint portion of RULER is being rolled out; the gist is to see the other person's perspective, even if you do not agree with him/her.
 - v) The schoolwide book clubs will examine Permission to Feel in February.

- d) N.Y. City Councilman proposal for P.A.s to pool their money; could lower donations at P.S. 101; P.A. has compromise proposal.
- e) Holiday Giving Campaign was successful.
 - i) The goal was to buy iPADs.
 - (1) Sixty-five will be gifted.
- f) The Spring After-School Program roll-out was successful.
 - i) Test prep was very popular.
- 3) C.E.P. Update.
 - a) Assessments toward goals are broken up into four cycles.
 - i) September November.
 - ii) November February.
 - iii) February to April.
 - iv) April to June.
 - b) The school is in the second cycle now, and the data from the first cycle was very good.
 - i) Usually, in the first cycle, there is a drop for students on or above grade level.
 - (1) This year, 63% was the first target for getting on or above grade level; the result was 81%.
 - ii) The second cycle target had been 70%, so it was elevated to 83% because the first cycle results were so good.
 - c) The 4th Grade teachers suggested that the reason for the good results was that Envisions spends longer time on concepts, whereas Go Math was "spiral" in that it went faster and then came back to earlier concepts.
 - d) Math subgroups 1st cycle benchmark data.
 - i) Special Needs:
 - (1) Goal was 50% on or above grade level.
 - (2) Attained 57%.
 - ii) ELL:
 - (1) Goal was 26% on or above grade level.
 - (2) Attained 71%.
