SeaKeepers Beach Cleanup on Monument Island, Miami

Volunteers collected a total of 116 pounds of trash and 28 pounds of recyclables!

On October 12th, 2019, SeaKeepers HQ held it's first island cleanup on Monument Island off of South Beach for International Coastal Cleanup Day. 48 volunteers were ferried by Fleet Miami's 'Julia' to collect 260 pounds of trash from the island. Most of the garbage found was styrofoam, plastic bottles, beer, soda cans, and plastic utensils. All of the cleanup findings were documented on The Ocean Conservancy's application "Clean Swell" where data goes into the world's largest ocean trash dataset. The findings help researchers and policy makers identify trends and create solutions. We are looking forward to our next island cleanup!
