



WHAT TO BRING ON YOUR FALL HUNT

- Heavy warm jacket** (my personal favorite for clothing is wool, but many of the new clothes are good as long as they're QUIET!)
- Hats**, heavy and light-weight
- Gloves**, two pair light and heavy
- Light Pants**
- Heavy Pants**
- Some type of rain gear**
- Heavy and light weight long johns**
- Socks and underwear** for each day
- Sturdy hiking boots** (two pair, non-insulated 0-200 grams, and warmer 400-800 grams)
- Camp shoes**
- 400 Sq. Inches Orange vest.** QUIET TYPE
Polar fleece works great (Rifle season)
- Warm sleeping bag** (foam pads provided)
- Personal Medications**, bath towel
- ***HUNTING LICENSE*****

ATTN: BOW HUNTERS: A sling to carry your bow is extremely helpful for carrying your bow on the horse. You must have an archery stamp from the state of Montana to bow hunt. Make sure you bring a copy of your prior years bow hunting stamp/tag/permit/ or license from any state or province. You can buy the stamp over the counter when you arrive if you would like to.

You should pack your duffel in soft duffel bags. One or two bags including your sleeping bag for a total of 60 lbs.

Each horse is rigged with a scabbard for a rifle.

Two sets of headlamps, it is dark at night in camp.

DAY PACK — please include the following:

- Bic lighters, matches
- Water bottle
- Compass
- Knife, small flash-light or headlamp (extra batteries)
- Binoculars
- Flagging Ribbon
- Camera and Extra film
- Toilet paper in plastic bag (very important)
- Rope or Parachute chord 20'
- Basic first aid kit
