



WEEKEND TRAFFIC ADVISORY

Friday April 8, 2011 to Sunday, April 10, 2011

As part of its citywide traffic improvement program, the New York City Department of Transportation has compiled a list of areas where Street construction or Street events will impede the normal flow of traffic this weekend.

MANHATTAN

East 59th Street between 2nd Avenue and 3rd Avenue: This street will be closed from 7am to 4pm Saturday and Sunday to facilitate NYCDDC trunk water main and utility work. Motorists should use alternate routes and posted detours to access Queensboro Bridge such as 2nd Avenue southbound or East 58th Street eastbound onto the Second Avenue contra flow lane.

Little West 12th Street between 9th Avenue and Washington Street: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 7am to 3pm to facilitate crane operation.

West 30th Street between 10th Avenue and 11th Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 8am to 6pm to facilitate crane operation.

East 30th Street between 3rd Avenue and 2nd Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 7am to 7pm to facilitate crane operation.

West 37th Street 6th Avenue and 5th Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday from 7am to 3pm to facilitate crane operation.

East 39th Street between Lexington Avenue and Third Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 8am to 6pm to facilitate crane operation.

East 45th Street between Lexington Avenue and Madison Avenue; Vanderbilt Avenue between East 44th Street and East 46th Street; Park Avenue viaduct southbound between East 46th Street and East 42nd Street; Vanderbilt Avenue northbound only between East 43rd Street and East 44th Street: These streets will be closed from 11pm Friday to 5am Monday to facilitate MTA East Side Access structural work.

West 47th Street between 9th Avenue and 10th Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 8am to 6pm to facilitate crane operation.

East 49th Street between Madison Avenue and Park Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 7am to 7pm to facilitate crane operation.

East 69th Street between 2nd Avenue and 1st Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 8am to 6pm to facilitate crane operation.

West 75th Street between 1st Avenue and York Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 8am to 3pm to facilitate crane operation.

East 86th Street between 2nd Avenue and 1st Avenue: One lane in each direction will be maintained from 8am to 6pm Saturday and Sunday to facilitate crane operation.

West 95th Street between West End Avenue and Broadway: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 8am to 4pm to facilitate crane operation.

West 112th Street between Broadway and Amsterdam Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday from 8am to 3pm to facilitate crane operation.

West 118th Street between Frederick Douglas Blvd. and St. Nicholas Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday from 8am to 3pm to facilitate crane operation.

West 169th Street between Haven Avenue and Ft. Washington Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 6am to 6pm to facilitate crane operation.

Haven Avenue West 168th Street and West 170th Street: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 6am to 6pm to facilitate crane operation.

Front Street between Maiden Lane and Fletcher Street: This street will be closed Saturday from 8am to 6pm or Sunday from 9am to 6pm to facilitate crane operation.

John Street between Broadway and Fulton Street: This street will be closed Saturday from 8am to 6pm or Sunday from 9am to 6pm to facilitate MTA/Con Edison operation.

Cliff Street between Fulton Street and John Street: This street will be closed Saturday from 8am to 6pm or Sunday from 9am to 6pm to facilitate NYC DDC operation.

Stone Street between Hanover Square and Coenties Alley; Mill Lane between Stone Street and South Williams Street: These streets will be closed Friday April 1, 2011 to Wednesday November 30, 2011 for the Stone Street Pedestrian Mall as permitted by the Mayor's Street Activity Permit Office (SAPO).

National Tartan Day Parade

The streets listed below will be closed Saturday from 2pm to 4:30pm for the National Tartan Day Parade as permitted by NYPD.

Formation:

- 44th Street & 45th Street between 5th Avenue and 6th Avenue

Route: 6th Avenue between 44th Street and 55th Street

Dispersal:

- 55th Street between 6th Avenue and 7th Avenue

IAC Demonstration

The streets listed below will be closed Saturday from 3:30pm to 6pm for the IAC Demonstration as permitted by the Mayor's Street Activity Permit Office (SAPO).

Route:

- Start in Union Square Park
- 14th Street between University Place and Broadway
- Broadway between 14th Street and Worth Street (into Foley Square)
- Worth Street between Broadway and Centre Street
- Lafayette Street between Worth Street and Duane Street

Persian Day Parade

The streets listed below will be closed Sunday from 12pm to 2pm for the Persian Day Parade as permitted by NYPD.

Formation:

- Madison Avenue between 41st Street and 40th Street

Route:

- Madison Avenue between 40th Street and 26th Street

Dispersal:

- Madison Avenue between 26th Street and 25th Street

MANHATTAN/BROOKLYN

Williamsburg Bridge: The North Outer Roadway will be closed Saturdays (rain date Sundays) from 5am to 6pm April 9. During these closures there will be four lanes maintained westbound to Manhattan (no trucks), and two lanes maintained eastbound to Brooklyn. Truck traffic should follow posted detour and use Manhattan Bridge.

Brooklyn Bridge:

This Bridge is closed to Manhattan-bound traffic overnight as of Monday night April 4th 2011 to perform necessary long term rehabilitation and repainting work. Brooklyn-bound traffic will be maintained throughout the project as will the span's pedestrian and cycling path. Motorists should follow signed routes to access the bridge leaving Manhattan. The northbound FDR exit to the Brooklyn Bridge is closed starting 1 hour before closure hours noted below. Motorists should use the prior South Street exit. The Brooklyn Queens Expressway eastbound exit to the Brooklyn Bridge is closed starting as early as 30 minutes before closure hours noted below. Motorists should proceed to the following Manhattan Bridge exit or use the prior Brooklyn Battery Tunnel (pay toll) exit for access to Manhattan. All work will occur overnight during off peak hours, when Manhattan-bound motorists will be detoured to the nearby Manhattan Bridge, or may choose other crossings. The full closure for traffic proceeding Manhattan bound/westbound overnight will occur Monday night through Friday morning between 11pm and 6am, Saturday 12:01am to 7am. These lane closures are necessary to facilitate NYCDOT Bridges rehabilitation work.

Brooklyn Bridge Eastbound:

One of three lanes will be closed 7:30am to 2:00pm Saturday to facilitate NYCDOT Bridges maintenance work.

BROOKLYN

Joe Torre-Little League Parade

The streets below will be closed Saturday from 9am to 11am for the Joe Torre-Little League Parade as permitted by NYPD.

Formation:

- Avenue S between 34th Street and Flatbush Avenue

Route:

- Flatbush Avenue between 35th Street and Avenue U
- Avenue U between Flatbush Avenue and East 36th Street

Dispersal:

- Into Ball Fields

Prospect Park Baseball Parade

The streets below will be closed Saturday from 10am to 11:30am for the Prospect Park Baseball Parade as permitted by NYPD.

Formation:

- 7th Avenue between President Street and Carroll Street

Route:

- 7th Avenue between Carroll Street and Ninth Street
- 9th Street between 7th Avenue and Prospect Park West

Dispersal:

- Into Ball Fields

BRONX

Webb Avenue between West 197th Street and Reservoir Avenue: This street will be closed Saturday and/or Sunday from 8am to 4pm to facilitate crane operation.

QUEENS

95/97/98th Streets between Jamaica Avenue and 91st Avenue: These streets will be closed 8pm Friday to 9pm Sunday to facilitate NYCT crane operation.

102nd Street between Jamaica Avenue and 91st Avenue: This street will be closed 8pm Friday to 9pm Sunday to facilitate NYC Transit crane operation.

Jamaica Avenue between 95th Street and 102 Street: One lane in each direction will be maintained from 8pm Friday to 9pm Sunday to facilitate NYC Transit crane operation.
